

## MIDDLETOWN RANCHERIA OF POMO INDIANS OF CALIFORNIA

## **CALIFORNIA SALES TAX EXEMPT FORM**

The Middletown Rancheria of Pomo Indians of California ("Middletown Rancheria" or "Tribe") is located at 22223 Highway 29 at Rancheria Road, in the County of Lake, Middletown, California.

The Middletown Rancheria was established by Secretarial Order in July of 1910 and the land of one hundred and eight (108) acres was purchased by the Tribe and appropriating funds by the Congressional Act for California Landless Indians in 1906.

The Middletown Rancheria became a Tribal Government initiated under the process of the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934 and obtained Trust Status by the Department of the Interior and Bureau of Indian Affairs. The Middletown Rancheria of Pomo Indians of California became a federally recognized Tribe.

Middletown Rancheria of Pomo Indians of California is exempt from California Sales Tax, including but not limited to; all businesses owned and operated by the Tribe for the following substances: merchandise, equipment, vehicles, modular buildings, trailers, motor homes, etc. Furthermore, any and all items delivered to the Rancheria shall receive exemption due to the Tribes Trust Status and Sovereign Immunity. Ownership of purchased items does not transfer until equipment arrives on the Middletown Rancheria property.

The Middletown Rancheria is d.b.a. Twin Pine Casino since November 1994 and as Twin Pine Casino & Hotel since March 2009.
