
Congrats to Mike Shaver who won 1st place with his Carved Frankenstein Pumpkin.





## Cultural Burn Team training hosted at Middletown Rancheria

On the weekend of October 15th and 16th, the Tribe hosted the Tribal ico-Restoration Alliance's training exercise weekend titled "Building the Burn Team, Operational and Tactical Drills," as part of the US Forest Service's funded Lake County Cal-TREX training series. The training ocused on building team cohesion, water handling equipment operation, and mock fire scenarios. TERA brought together a team of highly skilled fire managers as instructors and attendees were a collection of Tribal Members, Cal-Fire and Forest Service staff, local fire council members, and interested local land owners. This training was completed by Tribal Members Jordan Reyes, Landon Simon, Josh Simon; and, Tribal staff ristian Viveros-Cardenas and Mike Shaver. These members and staff can ow participate in prescribed and cultural burns conducted in the region by TERA over the upcoming wet season.
