

Middletown Rancheria Behavioral Health News Listening to your children.


First, we need to really listen to our child with our eyes, heart and ears. Listening with just your ears isn't good enough, because only 7 % percent of communication is contained in the words we use. The rest comes from body language and how we say those words. To hear what our children are saying, we need to listen to what they are not saying. No matter how hard our children may appear on the surface, most of our children have a tender inside and have a desperate need to be understood by their parents.

Second, stand in your children's' shoes in this season. Parents, to become genuine listeners we need to take our shoes off and stand in their shoes.In other words "until you walk in someone else moccasins you can't imagine the smell". You must try and see the world as they see it and try to feel as they feel.

Third, practice mirroring. Think like a mirror. It doesn't judge. It doesn't give advice. It reflects. Mirroring isn't mimicking. Mimicking is when someone repeats exactly what the other person says like a parrot.

Repeat back to yourself what your children are saying in your own words. What are your children saying and feeling and try to discern what is not being said and why.


Understanding today's youth is not a sprint, it's a marathon. It might take a while, but it's the way to go for a successful relationship with
